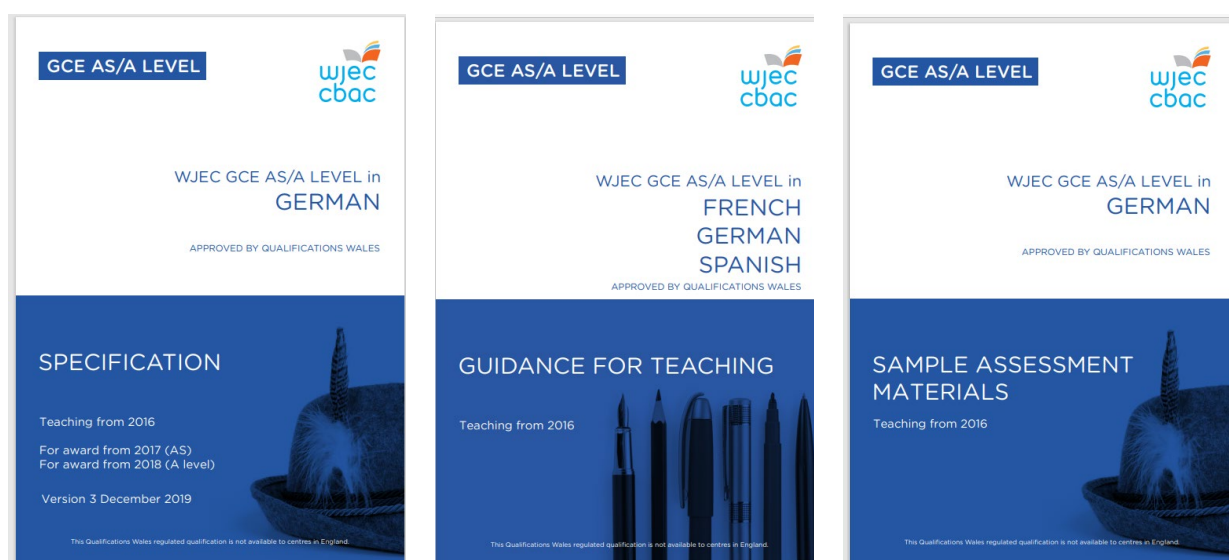

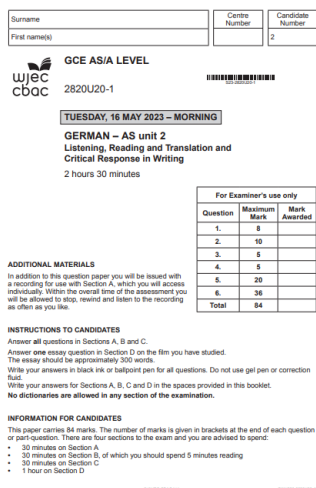

3. Marking Schemes

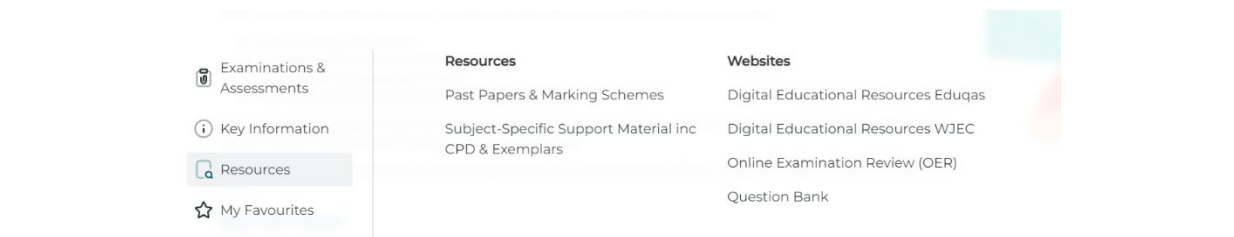

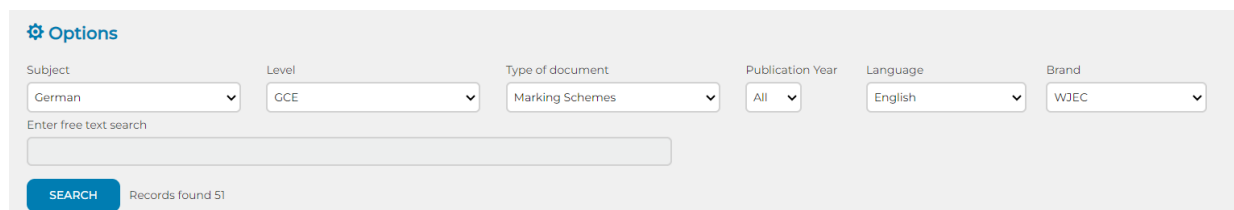

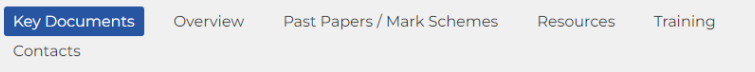


4. Examiners' Reports



The Principal Examiners' reports provide helpful observations and commentary on candidates' performance across the examined series.

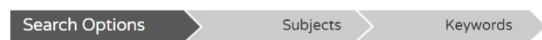

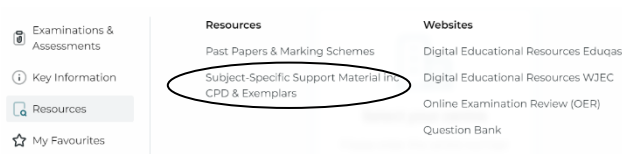

The focus of each year's provision is outlined below:

Spring 2024	Teacher-Conducted Assessment Training – how to conduct effective Unit 1 and Unit 3 examinations, and feedback from the Summer 2023 exam series (Unit 1). The training also includes teaching and learning tips to improve pupil performance in speaking examinations.
Autumn 2022	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2022 summer series, with a focus on Unit 1 (Discussion Card), Unit 3 (IRP), Unit 4 (Listening, Reading, and Translation) and Unit 5 (Critical and Analytical Response in Writing).
Autumn 2021	Unit 1 - AS Speaking in French, German, and Spanish – training teachers in developing speaking skills, conducting the test, with questions, answers and discussion from one of our Principal Examiners.
Autumn 2020	Assessment > classroom practice – Approaches to teaching film and literature in MFL at GCE level.
Autumn 2019	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2019 summer series; exploring A03 approaches to context in assessment and teaching.
Autumn 2018	Assessment > classroom practice – review of the 2018 summer assessment series and exploration of examples of marked candidate responses.

Exam Walk-Through

Aimed at learners, this [Exam Walk Through](#) resource offers practical hints and tips on how to effectively approach questions in the examination paper. Using questions from past exam papers, the PPT with audio help and audio script in the notes will walk teachers and pupils through a mock examination paper, helping to revise and practice useful exam techniques. The “mock” can be completed in a single sitting, or pupils can tackle one or two questions at a time or revisit some parts of the presentation to reinforce your learning.

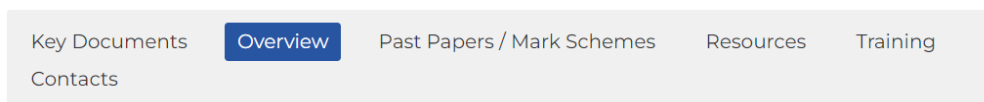

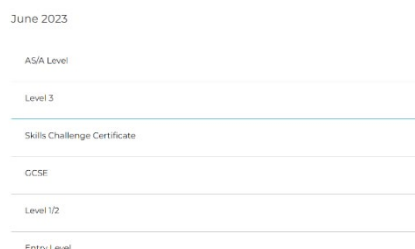

Grade boundary information is available for every unit. Make sure you select the correct information from the drop down:

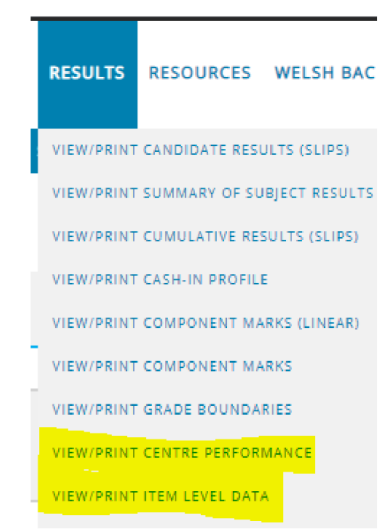


The overall [UMS grade boundaries](#) are available in the specification and on the Results, Grade Boundaries and PRS page of the website. These boundaries remain the same year on year.

Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on [Portal](#), and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.


