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## About this pack: information for teachers

This pack contains the assessment materials for Unit 2: Distribution and exhibition strategies of digital media and film industries in Wales.

Within this pack, you will find:

- information for teachers on how to manage arrangements for assessment
- a candidate mark record form
- a **candidate assessment pack** which includes:
  - an overview of requirements
  - assessment information: a detailed breakdown of each task, the evidence required, and the assessment conditions (controls) under which the task is to be completed, including timing and resources

## Managing the assessment

This is a centre-marked (internal) non-examination assessment. The following arrangements must be followed when managing and marking the assessment.

### Task setting

This assignment has been produced by WJEC and cannot be changed.

### Time

Candidates must be allowed **18 hours** to complete this assignment.

## Assessment conditions

There are three levels of Assessment conditions: high, medium and low. The conditions relevant for this unit are stated below:

## Supervision

## **Authentication**

Supervision must be in place to ensure the authenticity of evidence produced for summative assessment.

Candidates can review and redraft evidence independently within the time controls for the assessment.

Candidates must sign the declaration to confirm that all evidence submitted for moderation is their own work and that any sources used have been acknowledged.

Teachers must see candidates' ideas in progress at least **three** times at different stages during the process to be able to authenticate the work as the candidate's own and complete the necessary authentication documentation.

Teachers must sign the declaration to confirm that evidence submitted for moderation was completed under the controlled conditions set out in this assessment.

## **Candidate evidence to submit for moderation**

- Task 1: Research  
Candidates must present evidence in line with the requirements outlined in the task (details found in the candidate assessment pack in the second part of this document).
- Task 2: Distribution Strategy and Exhibition Strategy  
Candidates must present evidence in line with the requirements outlined in the task.
- Candidate declaration form (see Appendix A).

## **Marking the assessment**

The mark schemes for this assessment are included in the candidate assessment pack.

All marking of evidence must be made against the mark scheme provided. Evidence marked must comply with any requirements set out in the candidate assessment pack.

Marking should only be undertaken by a designated assessor. An assessor should have appropriate expertise in the subject and level for a specified unit. The assessor is responsible for ensuring that:

- assessment is conducted under the controls specified in the candidate assessment pack
- they are clear about the requirements of the assessment and mark scheme prior to commencing assessment
- evidence presented for assessment is valid, authentic; reliable and credible
- assessment decisions are accurately recorded
- judgements are only made against the mark band statements.

A mark record form must be completed for each candidate.

## Assessment Details

### Tasks

Candidates are required to build a portfolio by conducting independent research and producing a case study exploring the success of **two** products produced by a digital media and/or film production company based in Wales. Candidates should assess how the genre codes and conventions of the products appeal to audiences, examine the processes involved in production and the strategies for distribution and exhibition. Candidates are then required to create a distribution strategy and an exhibition strategy for a new Welsh digital media and/or film production company. There are two tasks for candidates to complete:

1. Choose one digital media and/or film production company based in Wales that produce one or more of the following products: television programmes, films, video games. Consider two of their digital media and/or film products and evaluate their success. Examine how the products use genre codes and conventions, how the products are produced and the strategies for distribution and exhibition.
2. You have been commissioned to propose a distribution strategy and an exhibition strategy for a new media product produced by a digital media and/or film production company based in Wales. Decide on **one** product that you feel could be produced by your production company and then plan how it will be distributed and exhibited.

The brief can be found in the candidate assessment pack.

## Guidance for assessment

Assessment may be undertaken at any time during the qualification. However, centres should ensure that assessment is completed only when candidates have undertaken the necessary teaching and learning and developed the required skills and knowledge.

The total mark for this unit is 72.

Each task has a separate assessment grid.

The appropriate band should be established by determining which performance descriptor from the mark scheme best reflects the candidate's performance.

The appropriate mark should then be established by determining the extent to which the candidate has met the criteria within the relevant band – completely met (upper part of band), mostly met (middle of band), partially met (lower part of band).

It is important that you work independently from other candidates and the work produced should be your own unaided work. You and your teacher will be required to sign a declaration that all work presented is your own work.

## Assessment Details

You are required to:

Build a portfolio by conducting independent research and producing a case study exploring the success of **two** products produced by a digital media and/or film production company in Wales. You should assess how the genre codes and conventions of the products appeal to audiences, examine the processes involved in the production and the strategies for distribution and exhibition. You are then required to create a distribution strategy and an exhibition strategy for a new Welsh production company.

There are **two** tasks for you to complete:

1. Choose one digital media and/or film production company based in Wales that produce one or more of the following products: television programmes, films, video games. Consider two of their digital media and/or film products and evaluate their success. Examine how the products use genre codes and conventions, how the products are produced and the strategies for distribution and exhibition.
2. You have been commissioned to propose a distribution strategy and an exhibition strategy for a new media product produced by a digital media and/or film production company based in Wales. Decide on **one** product that you feel could be produced by your production company and then plan how it will be distributed and exhibited.

## Brief

### Task 1

Choose one digital media and/or film production company based in Wales that produce one or more of the following products: television programmes, films, video games. Consider two of their digital media and/or film products and evaluate their success. Examine how the products use genre codes and conventions, how the products are produced and the strategies for distribution and exhibition.

You can choose to present the task in any of the formats noted below (or any other suitable format):

- audio presentation
- audio visual presentation
- PowerPoint
- written prose.

The word limit is 750-1000 words if presented in a written format, or 6-8 minutes if presented in an audio format. If your work exceeds the maximum length, only the first 1000 words or 8 minutes will be assessed.

- **Examples of suitable products:** Television programmes e.g. *Keeping Faith/Un Bore Mercher and Dal y Mellt/Rough Cut* (Vox Pictures), *Yr Amgueddfa* and *Creisis* (Boom Cymru)
- Films e.g. *Mr. Burton* and *One Way to Denmark* (Severn Screen), *The Toll* and *Timestalker* (Western Edge Pictures)
- Video games e.g. *Maid of Sker* and *The Bunker* (Wales Interactive)

Your research into the products should be completed individually. Your findings must address the following questions:

- a. Evaluate how the company's **two** products have used genre codes and conventions to appeal to audiences. [8 marks]
- b. Analyse how the production of the **two** products (such as financing, development, collaboration, key job roles) contribute to its success. [8 marks]
- c. Evaluate how the distribution and exhibition strategies of the **two** products (such as social media, interviews, film festivals) promote the product to its target audience. [8 marks]

## Task 2

You have been commissioned to propose a distribution strategy and an exhibition strategy for a new media product produced by a digital media and/or film production company based in Wales. Decide on **one** product that you feel could be produced by your production company and then plan how it will be distributed and exhibited.

- a. Explain your proposed product and new Welsh production company.

You should include:

- a brief mission statement for the production company
- a tagline for the production company
- a brief description of the product and a stated target audience for the product.

[6 marks]

- b. Create **one** distribution strategy and **one** exhibition strategy selected from the options below.

[18 marks for each strategy]

### Distribution Strategies

#### Option 1

##### Plan a social media campaign strategy including:

- A schedule for pre and post release content including platforms, content and timeline
- An outline for **two** digitally produced visual and/or audio examples of social media content
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### Option 2

##### Plan a collaboration campaign (such as influencers or sponsors) and/or partnership strategy including:

- A plan of **two** proposed collaborations including objectives, proposed content and timeline
- An outline for **two** digitally produced visual and/or audio examples of collaborative content
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### Option 3

##### Plan a page of a website including:

- A mock-up of the homepage, including layout, content and design
- An outline for **two** digitally produced examples of interactive content to feature on the website (e.g. a poll, a survey, a mini demo of a video game)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### Option 4

##### Plan a merchandise package including:

- A list of physical and digital merchandise including prices and proposed retailers

- An outline for **two** digitally produced visual examples of digital merchandise (e.g. screensavers, digital art)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

### **Exhibition Strategies**

*You must use original footage, images or text for the majority of your exhibition product.*

#### **Option 1**

##### **Plan a festival showcasing your product including:**

- A detailed schedule of the event.
- A digital poster advertising the event, or a radio or podcast advert advertising the event (up to one-minute)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### **Option 2:**

##### **Plan a local event showcasing your product including:**

- A detailed timeline/schedule of the event and the location.
- A digital poster advertising the event, or a radio or podcast advert advertising the event (up to one-minute)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### **Option 3:**

##### **Plan a release schedule including:**

- A detailed schedule of exhibition platforms and release dates.
- A digital teaser image advertising the release of the product, or a radio or podcast advert advertising the event (up to one-minute)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

OR

#### **Option 4**

##### **Plan an immersive experience including:**

- A detailed description and schedule of the experience.
- A visual digital advert for the experience, or a radio or podcast advert advertising the event (up to one-minute)
- A justification of why this strategy is appropriate for your new product, including the intended impact of the strategy.

c. Explain how your strategies communicate meaning to target audiences.

## Information for candidates

The following information has been taken from the [JCQ Information for candidates – non-examination assessments](#) and the [JCQ Artificial Intelligence \(AI\) Use in Assessments: Protecting the Integrity of Qualifications](#). This tells you about things that you **must** and **must not** do when you are completing your assessment. If there is anything that you do not understand, you **must** ask your teacher.

### Preparing your work

- When you submit your work and sign your candidate declaration form, you need to ensure that your final product reflects your own independent work and isn't copied or paraphrased from another source such as an AI tool.
- Where you have applied the use of AI to aid research, this must be declared within the candidate declaration form.
- If you receive help and guidance from someone other than your teacher, you **must** tell your teacher who will then record the nature of the assistance given to you.
- Take care of your work and keep it safe. **Do not** leave it lying around where your classmates can find it or share it with anyone, including posting it on social media. You **must** always keep your work secure and confidential whilst you are preparing it; **do not** share it with your classmates. If it is stored on the computer network, keep your password secure. Collect all copies from the printer and destroy those you do not need.
- **Do not** be tempted to use pre-prepared online solutions (such as those produced by AI tools and chatbots) – this is cheating. Electronic tools used by WJEC can detect this sort of copying.
- You **must not** write inappropriate, offensive or obscene material.

### Plagiarism

Plagiarism involves taking someone else's words, thoughts or ideas and trying to pass them off as your own. **It is a form of cheating which is taken very seriously.** Don't think you won't be caught; there are many ways to detect plagiarism:

- Markers can spot changes in the style of writing and use of language.
- Markers are highly experienced subject specialists – they may have read the source you are using, or even marked the work you have copied from!
- Internet search engines and specialised computer software can be used to match phrases or pieces of text with original sources and to detect changes in the grammar and style of writing or punctuation.

### Penalties for breaking the regulations

If it is discovered that you have broken the regulations, one of the following penalties will be applied:

- the piece of work will be awarded zero marks
- you will be disqualified from that unit for the assessment series in question
- you will be disqualified from the whole subject for that assessment series
- you will be disqualified from all subjects and barred from entering again for a period of time.

WJEC will decide which penalty is appropriate.

**Remember – it's your qualification so it needs to be your own work.**

## Mark scheme
