

Summer 2021: Summary of approaches to grading WJEC Vocational and Other General Qualifications Version 2 – 26 March 2021

This document provides information for centres **in Wales** on the arrangements for awarding WJEC Vocational and Other General qualifications in Summer 2021.

The table below provides a summary of the approach for each qualification type and a rationale for their inclusion as *in scope* qualifications.

Arrangements for non- certificating (mid-flight) learners	
Learners who are part-way through their qualifications and would normally be completing unit assessments this summer are eligible to receive unit TAGs for these units. We are currently working with other JCQ vocational awarding organisations to develop a consistent approach and window for collecting unit TAGs. This activity will take place later in the academic year to maximise teaching and learning time.
