Subject webpage

The Level 1 Latin <u>subject webpage</u> on the WJEC website is the starting place for anyone teaching the specification and contains a range of official documentation relating to the qualification including the specification, sample assessment materials and past papers.

Secure website

The <u>secure website</u> gives teachers access to past papers and marking schemes ahead of their publication on the public website.

For teachers to access the secure website, they will need a username and password, which can be set up by their Examinations Officer.

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


1. Key Documents


Past papers on secure website (shortly after end of exam series)

Past papers are published initially on the <u>secure website</u> shortly after the end of the examination series.

Then use the dropdown menus to choose the papers that you are looking for:




Past papers on public website (from six months after Results day)

3. Marking Schemes



Marking schemes are available to accompany question papers from past examination series, providing instructions on how to apply the marking criteria, examples of indicative content, and assessment grids articulating the banded descriptors for different levels of responses.


Marking schemes on secure website (from Results day)







6. Grade Boundaries and Exam Results analysis

Grade boundaries

Unit grade boundaries and raw marks to UMS conversion tables are available from the <u>secure website</u>. These can be accessed by selecting 'View/Print Grade Boundaries' from the 'Results' menu at the top of the screen, followed by the series that you need the grade boundaries for.



You can then use the drop-down menus to select the relevant unit.



Overall UMS grade boundaries are listed in the specification and are copied below.

Exam Results Analysis




Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate/cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

It can be accessed on the <u>secure website</u> and allows you to compare your students' performance on each question with that of the candidature overall, letting you see where they have done well and where there might be room for improvement. To do this, under the 'Results' tab, click on 'View/Print Item Level Data' or 'View/Print Centre Performance' for comparable data.






7. Key Dates
