3. Marking Schemes

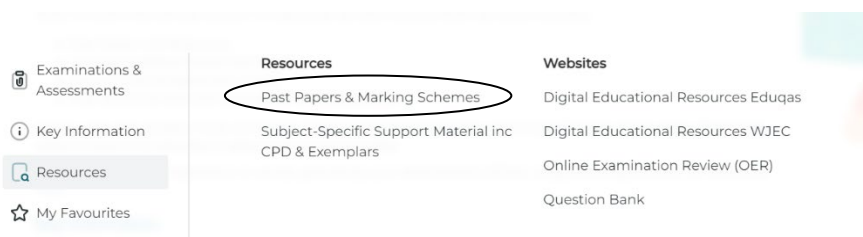

4. Examiners' Reports

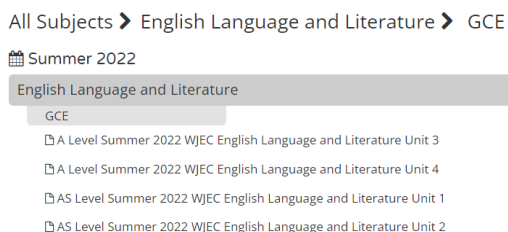


The Principal Examiners' reports (called 'Examiner's Reports') provide helpful observations and commentary on candidates' performance across the examined series.

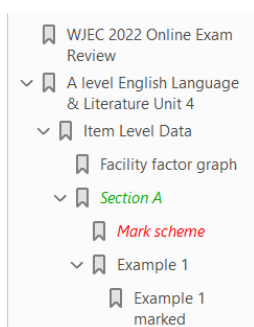

5. Online Exam Review (Marked Exemplar)

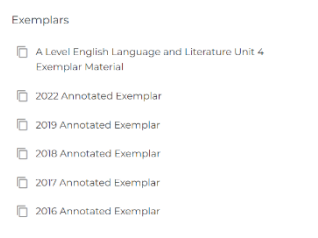
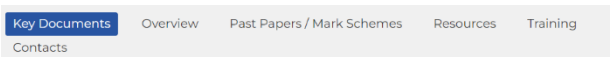

Exam Results Analysis



Exam Results Analysis can be used by teachers to:

- Evaluate their own performance against specification norms.
- Identify strengths and weaknesses for a candidate cohort and suggest areas of improvement.
- Assist individual candidates in improving their own performance.

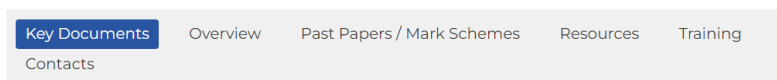

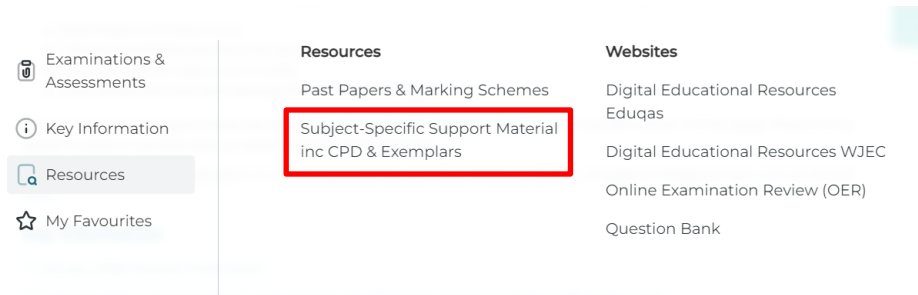

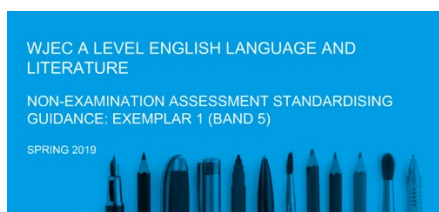
