Submitting work through e-submission

The process of submitting work online is straightforward and easy. Please refer to the subject specifications for details of the work to be submitted. The latest versions can be found on our website: www.wjec.co.uk

We will be here to help you throughout the process. In addition, we have developed a helpful guide and a video tutorial which are available from our dedicated e-submission webpages, simply visit www.wjec.co.uk/teachers/e-submission/

Please note, the moderation process does not commence until after the deadline for submission. We reserve the right to request the work of additional candidates **to aid in a fair moderation process.** It is therefore essential that you have all work ready to be uploaded if required.

What should I be doing now?

Teachers and Examination Officers

As you prepare to submit work electronically, we recommend you take the following steps:

- 1. Refer to the E-submission subject guide 2019-20 for information on the types of file you will be able to upload. You can find this by selecting the name of the subject in the list above or you can view a complete set of all subject requirements here.
- 2. To speed up the process of uploading work online, we advise that work is saved in the correct format when it is created, to avoid having to convert files at a later stage. Where possible, encourage candidates to work electronically, or if documents will need to be scanned, do this as you go along, saving with appropriate filenames. There are a number of apps available for smartphones and tablets which will do this easily and create pdf files.

Please note, file names can only be made up of letters and numbers, with no special characters e.g. ?,! /\$. You should ensure that files are named so that they can be easily identified, by including candidate names or numbers and the task title.

- 3. As you complete paperwork and forms, ensure that they are all signed as necessary. Work submitted without the correct authentication may result in a candidate being awarded zero. All forms can be downloaded from the subject pages of our websites, or from the Secure Website for Welsh Baccalaureate subjects.
- 4. Check that all files are correct and complete, including that audio and video files will play to the end, and create a back-up of everything in case of any computer or network problems.

Examination Officers only

- 1. Forward this newsletter to the relevant member(s) of staff in your centre who are responsible for the subjects listed above.
- 2. Check that you are able to log into the <u>Surpass</u> website. Click 'Can't Access Your Account?' if you need to rest your account. You will need to be able to log in to obtain the keycodes for each candidate which are required to submit work electronically. For internally assessed units and components these will be available for the sampled candidates within 48 working hours after marks are submitted on IAMIS and can be used immediately.

What is the timeline for uploads?

The table below outlines the key dates and processes linked to E-Submission

21 st February	The deadline for entries to be made for all subjects	
10 th March	IAMIS (mark submissions) system is available for GCSE internally assessed units and components.	
20 th March	Keycodes will be available for submission of GCE AS and A level externally assessed units and components.	
1 st April	IAMIS (mark submissions) system is available for GCE AS and A Level internally assessed units and components	
23rd April	IAMIS (mark submission) will be available for National/Foundation Welsh Baccalaureate.	
1 st May	Last day to input GCSE internal assessment marks on IAMIS and allow for creation of keycodes before the submission deadline	
5 th May	Deadline for uploading required GCSE candidate work	
5 th May	Last day to input National/Foundation Welsh Baccalaureate internal assessment marks on IAMIS to allow for delivery of keycodes before the submission deadline.	
7 th May	IAMIS (mark submission) will be available for Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate	
7 th May	Deadline for uploading required National/Foundation Welsh Baccalaureate candidate work.	
13 th May	Last day to input GCE AS and A Level internal assessment marks on IAMIS to allow for delivery of keycodes before the submission deadline.	
15 th May	Deadline for uploading required GCE AS and A Level candidate work	
20 th May	Last day to input Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate internal assessment marks on IAMIS and allow for delivery of keycodes before the submission deadline.	
22 nd May	Deadline for uploading required Advanced Welsh Baccalaureate candidate work.
