


ENTRY PATHWAYS QUALIFICATION IN PERSONAL PROGRESS

This qualification allows you to complete a choice of units covering a range of topics. The units are all coursework based, there is no need to sit written examinations. There are a range of units available all of which are at Entry 1. The Entry Pathways qualifications are inclusive, flexible and practical giving you the opportunity to develop, demonstrate and participate in a range of activities covering a range of topics.

What will I study?

The specification in Entry Pathways Personal Progress contains units that will enable you to gain an insight into a wide range of topics. What skills will I develop?

By studying units within the Entry Pathways Personal Progress qualification, skills developed could include:

- developing skills for the workplace
- developing communication skills
- developing writing skills
- developing IT skills
- developing independent living skills

These are just a selection of the skills that could be developed. There are a large number of units available, which would allow you to develop a range of other skills in your specific areas of interest.

How will I be assessed?

All units are coursework based; no written examination is required. In order to achieve a qualification in Entry Pathways Personal Progress, learners will have to accumulate credits, gained from completing various units.

These lead to (three sizes) of qualification:

Entry 1 Award (8 or more credits)

Entry 1 Certificate (14 or more credits)

Entry 1 Diploma (37 or more credits)

Careers with Entry Pathways qualification in Personal Progress

This qualification will build on subject content which you will have been taught at Key Stage 3 and will provide a foundation for other Entry Pathways qualifications and level 1 and 2 qualifications. This course also develops the skills and confidence you will need to leave school in preparation for the workplace.
