## REQUIREMENTS FOR SUMMER 2023

As announced by qualification Wales, WJEC will be providing Advanced Information for written external assessments. This will be released in the spring term and is to help focus learners' revision. The aim should still be to cover all specification content in teaching and learning.

In 2022 WJEC streamlined specification content for assessment in AS examinations. Therefore, learners may not have studied the topics which were not subject to assessment in 2022 in their AS. In order not to disadvantage learners who sat their AS units in 2022, the AS content that was identified in the adaptations booklet as not subject to assessment will not be subject to assessment in the A2 assessments in 2023.
