Assessment Resources	<p>These are sets of questions designed to be taken in a one hour lesson; each resource is numbered for reference. Use of our assessment resources is not compulsory, but they could form part of the range of evidence teachers could use to determine grades. They are taken mainly from past papers with some material from the A20 series that could be new to students. <p>Grading Exemplar</p>	<p>These exemplar materials are provided to centres to support teachers when making holistic judgements about student performance and should be used in conjunction with the grade descriptors. The data provides a detailed analysis of the performance of candidates on each item (question or part question) that can be used for comparing performance.
