



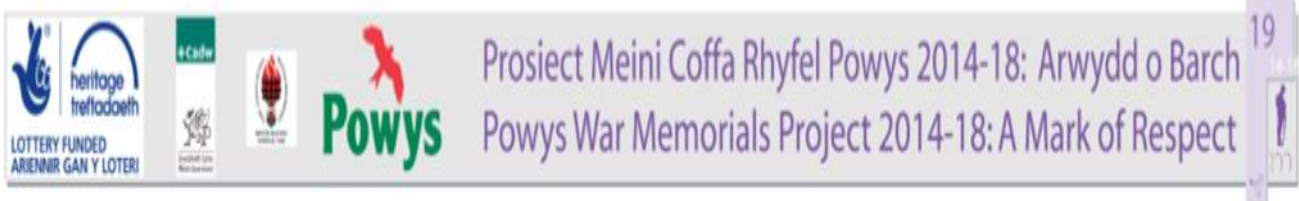

Commemorating World War One with Walks.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Community Challenge is to develop learners' skills, whilst encouraging learners to identify, develop and participate in opportunities that will benefit a community. During the Community Challenge learners will explicitly develop skills of **Planning and Organisation** and **Personal Effectiveness** and apply them in an appropriate manner.

BRIEF

In this Challenge you will be given the opportunity to make a positive contribution to the local, regional and national community. You will focus on real-life needs whilst engaging in activities which aim to make a real difference. The Community Challenge should provide experiences that help you understand what it means to be an active citizen. The challenge should enable you to develop as effective and responsible members of the community. In completing the Community Challenge you will be able to recognise the contributions you can make towards improving the chosen community and the benefits this will have for you, for others and for the environment. Where appropriate, you will be able to demonstrate independence, responsibility and an ability to work well with others.



Being able to transfer your knowledge, understanding and skills to others is the essence of coaching. This process can help others develop their skills, confidence and understanding whilst achieving their personal goals.

The Powys War Memorials Project is a four year project, mainly funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), to commemorate the centenary of World War 1. The project covers the whole of Powys. One of the project outcomes is to develop a series of walks and trails, relating to World War 1, in towns and villages across Powys.

The Powys War Memorials Project is inviting you to help produce the World War 1 walks and trails. Producing a World War 1 walk or trail will enable you to help others to develop their knowledge and understanding of World War 1. You must actively engage and demonstrate commitment over a minimum of 30 hours and at least 4 weeks to develop the World War 1 walk or trail. This Challenge would be particularly suitable for students considering a course or career in geography, history, heritage, education or the travel and tourism sector.
