Frequently Asked Questions

Legacy specification re-sit opportunities in November 2016 and June 2017

Unit 1 Oracy

- The full DVD of exemplar material will be sent to centres after the last CPD session
- There will be 5 Individual Researched Presentations and 3 Group Discussions on this DVD
- A commentary will be available for each candidate/activity on the DVD and will contain formative and summative comments as well as the split marks
- The commentary will be posted on the secure website at the same time that the DVD is sent to centres
- There is no longer any requirement to submit standardisation assessment sheets to WJEC prior to submitting Unit 1: Oracy marks
- All notes should be sent in with the sample. There are examples of notes in your delegate packs. Notes can be in hard copy or scanned on to your storage device
