SUMMARY OF ASSESSMENT SUMMER 2022 ONLY

Component 1: American film Written examination: 1 1/2 hours 35% of qualification - NO CHANGES

This component assesses knowledge and understanding of three American films.

- Section A: Hollywood 1930-1990 (comparative study) One two-part question, requiring reference to two Hollywood films, one produced between 1930 and 1960 and the other between 1961 and 1990. There is a choice of question in the second part.
- Section B: Contemporary American independent film One two-part question, requiring reference to one contemporary American independent film (produced after 2010). There is a choice of questions in the second part. Advance Information on the focus of the content of the exam has been provided for this component <u>here</u>.

Component 2: European film Written examination: 1 1/2 hours 35% of qualification - NO CHANGES

This component assesses knowledge and understanding of **two** British films and **one** non-English language European film.

- Section A: British film (two-film study) One two-part question, requiring reference to two recent British films. There is a choice of question in the second part.
- Section B: Non-English language European film
 One two-part question, requiring reference to one non-English language European film.
 There is a choice of questions in the second part.

Component 3: Production Non-exam assessment 30% of qualification

This component assesses **one** production and its accompanying evaluative analysis. **Production (20%)**

- Either an extract from a film highlighting narrative construction (1.5 to 3.5 minutes)
- Or a screenplay for an extract from a film highlighting narrative construction of between 1200 and 1400 words *plus* a digitally photographed or hand-drawn storyboard of a key section from the screenplay (approximately 1.5 minutes' screen time, corresponding to approximately 15 storyboard shots).
- Plus, an evaluative analysis (1000-1250 words)

Summary of changes

These adaptations are the same as those permitted in 2021. The summary below outlines how they differ to the specification.

Component 1: American Film

There are no changes to this component.

Component 2: European Film

There are no changes to this component.

Component 3: Production

This component assesses **one** production and its evaluative analysis.

Learners produce:

- Either an extract from a film highlighting narrative construction (1.5 to 3.5 minutes)
- Or a screenplay for an extract from a film highlighting narrative construction of between 1200 and 1400 words *plus* a digitally photographed or hand-drawn storyboard of a key section from the screenplay (approximately 1.5 minutes' screen time, corresponding to approximately 15 storyboard shots).
- Plus an evaluative analysis (1000-1250 words)

Option	Changes
Film extract	The running time has been reduced by one minute. Candidates are now permitted to submit a film between 1.5 and 3.5 minutes
Screenplay plus storyboard	No changes to the screenplay brief. The storyboard may now be hand-drawn or digitally photographed. Candidates are permitted to use a maximum of 5 found images. Evaluative analysis	No changes.
